♦ Outline and characteristics of the course for Teacher Training Students O Characteristics of the program

Since one of the aim of the Graduate School of Education is to provide the recurrent education including the theoretical and practical studies for teachers, two-thirds of the quota of the graduate students is allocated to incumbent teachers in Japan. Thus, the international students can exchange their views and experiences with these students including teachers to lead productive student lives.

Students will take a six-month intensive Japanese language course designated by MEXT. However, if the student has a certain level of Japanese language ability, he or she will receive specialized training at JEUN for one and a half years.

We offer supplementary Japanese language course according to student's stage in Japanese ability.

Specialized training

[One year course for students required the intensive course]

Students take supplementary basic courses of Japanese conversation. writing and reading etc. Students enroll respective courses according to their specialties to receive individual guidance by an academic advisor. They present their reports as results of the Training Program.

One and a half year course for students who are NOT required the intensive course

Students take supplementary courses of Japanese conversation, writing and reading etc. Students enroll respective courses according to their specialties to receive individual guidance by an academic advisor. They present their reports as results of the Training Program.

Students can enroll participatory subjects such as educational practicum at elementary schools.
